Do you want to know more about the Wadden Sea? This is what we have learned:

The Wadden Sea is a very special sea in the North of Germany and the South of Denmark. There we have high tide and low tide. Low tide is when the water goes away. When the water comes back, it is called high tide. The low tide lasts 6 hours and 12,5 minutes and the high tide lasts 6 hours and 12,5 minutes, too.

When it is very stormy the water rises higher than normal. Because of that people built dykes.

The Wadden Sea is a national park. A lot of animals for example crabs live there. You can see if a crab is female or male when your turn it. If there is a triangle it is male, if there is a half circle it is a female. The shells on the ground are very sharp. 10 kids cut their feet. Sand worms live under the wadden sand. It is a dangerous worm because it has little teeth. With its teeth he eats plankton, algae and other worms.
